## **BRITISH NATIONALS (OPEN WEEK) & EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIP**

HAYLING ISLAND - JULY 1999

A good friend of mine, who is very familiar with Hayling Island waters, told me a few months ago that "everything is possible there. Sun, rain, wind, calm..." Well, he was totally right!

We got sun and rain, and also all sailing conditions, starting with a very light wind day, but also with some 20 knots races.

After a few years racing separate, the men and the women sailed again together during the British

Nationals and Open Week. 151 entries, I must admit that it was really interesting! The boys had big troubles to beat the girls! I think that more than one must decided that he need to train more.

Sari Multala (FIN) won the Open Week thanks to her first place on the last race, followed by Jacek Zbierski (POL), Margriet Matthijsse (NED), Soren Johnsen (DEN) and Christiane Petzke (GER).

Everything was ready for the Europeans. 121 women sailing in 3 groups and 98 men in 2 groups. The first day with very light wind conditions, was a good test for some sailors's nerves. Sari

(FIN) and Sarah (NZL) on the women's fleet and Jazek (POL) had to carry on the heavy weight of two very bad results until the end of the championship, no more mistakes permitted.

Local sailor Shirley Robertson (GBR) and formal World Champion Margriet Matthijsse (NED) fighted from the first race to be on the top. Only 1st and 2nd places during the qualification races...not too bad... From the very beginning they were 1st and 2nd, far from the rest.

Sarah Blanck (AUS), discreetly placed

herself on the 3rd place and she would not move until the end.

On the men, after a bad first day, Jacek climbed day by day on the overal with the permition of Marko Visic (CRO) and Tor Theodorsen (NOR) who performed a good championship as well. The "Danish Army" - Soren Johnsen and Kristian Kjaergaard wanted the highest places on the podium. The last day was really exciting. On the women's course, before the last race Margriet and Shirley were 1st and 2nd. We

saw a spectacular match racing pre-start between these two competitors, sailing around 40 other sailors trying to start normally. Never seen before! But a rule 42 yellow flag immediately after the start fin-

> ished the game for Shirley, and the way was free for Margriet who did not lost the opportunity and finished 4th on that race. Enough to win the Europeans.

> And the men, nearly the same! Soren was very bad on the first race (33rd) but Kristian, who could take him the 1st place, only performed an 11th. Winning the last race,

Soren got the Championship, Kristian 2nd and Jacek 3rd.

Just a few words to the Organisers. Well done, correct courses, good starting lines,etc... The general feeling was very positive. Thanks to all the Race Committee and Jury teams and, of course to the Hayling Island Sailing Club staff.
